CORONA VIRUS

Reminder for all staff during the COVID 19 Pandemic:

As soon as you arrive, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and check your temperature. Take your temperature upon arriving for shift and enter your name and temperature on a log. In the absence of a scan thermometer, use a probe thermometer and thoroughly clean with sanitizer or warm soapy water after use. **Do not use the probe thermometer in your mouth. Take your temperature under your arm.**

All individuals will have his or her temperature taken every morning at 8am and every evening at 8pm. The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. However, as a reminder, CDC always recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- i) Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- ii) Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- iii) Stay home when you are sick.
- iv) Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- v) Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe or warm soapy water if not available.
- vi) Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- vii) If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

Staff who have been infected by the Coronavirus:

Staff need to be fever free for over 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medication, if you do not have a test to determine if you are still contagious. You can leave home after these three things have happened:

You have had no fever for at least 72 hours (that is three full days of no fever without the use medicine that reduces fevers)

AND

other symptoms have improved (for example, when your cough or shortness of breath have improved)

AND

at least 7 days have passed since your symptoms first appeared
